The barn dates from the 1700s. Formerly an old dairy and milking parlour; it was converted by self and friends/family using and reusing materials that we found or had been recycled. We tried to keep the story of the building rather than starting afresh! We used a lot of Hemp made on site to give building breathability and natural feel. The low impact stove burns our own grown timber which is solar kiln dried (made from scrap/recycled material).

Two families sold their own homes to buy the farm, with barns to convert. The whole project took 5 years to do. We aim to develop it into a Care Farm for vulnerable people.

Low carbon measures on show

- **Low-cost improvements**: Additional roof insulation Wool.
- 'Big' insulation works: Wall insulation - Hemp/lime. Underfloor and ceiling insulation - Celotex.
- **Glazing**: Double/triple glass,
- **Renewable heat**: Air source heat pump (e property.) Wood burning stove, Solar kiln
- **Renewable electricity**: solar PV
- Sustainable building materials: Used recycled wood all over. eg stairs floorboards doors, joists, stone.
- Lifestyle changes: Making hemp and growing timber

Personal insights

We chose to do these things because of personal values, beliefs e.g. Faith, global issues, desire for a simple lifestyle. Hemp may be of interest as fairly new technology/techniques. Recycling and resourcefulness are key principles, and we use a lot of local and "scrounged" stuff! Working together and enjoying a creative project gives healthy meaningful work and lives.
